

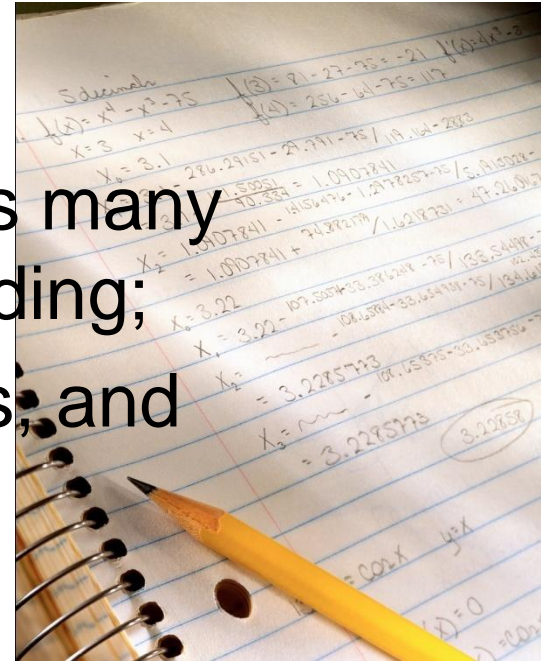

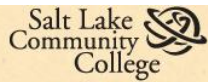

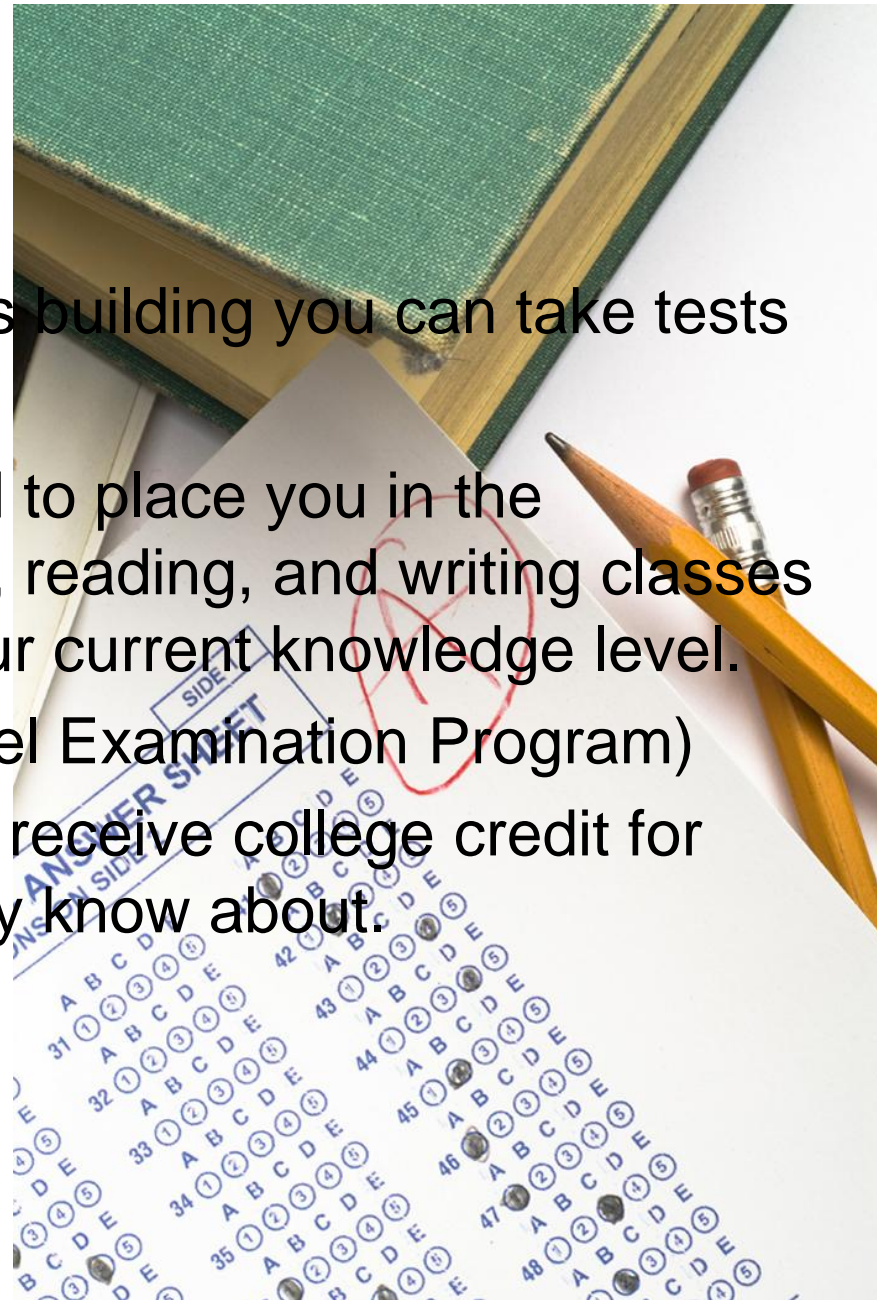
ZAK BASTA ON STUDENT WRITING CENTER

- The student writing center is a great resource for students enrolled at SLCC. You can bring writing from any class and receive help on formatting, editing, adding material, etc. from the friendly tutors there. You can be at any stage of the writing process -- whether you are brainstorming ideas, you're on your first draft, second draft, or anywhere in between. Now, it's not simply a place to go and hand your paper over for fixing. The tutors there will work with a student on anything they feel they need assistance with, but they won't just do the work for you. The idea is to help students to become better, more educated writers -- developing skills necessary for advancement in school and life. It's a good idea to be prepared with an analysis or some basic knowledge of your own writing abilities so that the tutors can better understand what skills you need help developing.
- Generally, the writing center is for students who need help writing full papers, but they are also willing to help with basically anything that involves writing, e.g. short answers to questions, small paragraphs, et cetera. The tutors in the center can be current or former students, or even faculty members of the English department, so they have a pretty good understanding of the situation a given student can be in. It is a good idea to make an appointment, as well. You can call them and set up an appointment over the phone, or even just show up if you're in the area and sign their list for an appointment as soon as they can get to you. Not only is the Student Writing Center a great place to get in person writing assistance, but they also have online options that include live chat, facebook information, and video tutorials. In addition to that and the main center at the Redwood Rd. campus, there are centers at the South City, Jordan, and Miller campuses.

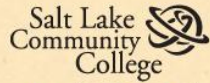


TESTING CENTER

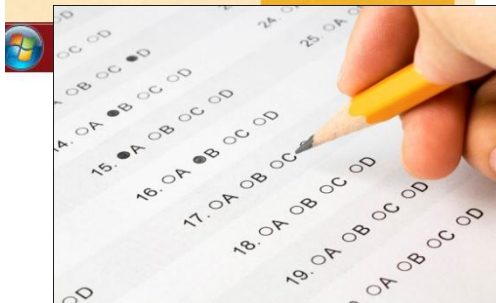

ANTHONY FERGUSON ON STUDENT TESTING AND ACCUPLACER TEST

- Chances are that if you go to SLCC, you've heard of the Accuplacer Test. This test helps you out by providing useful info on your skills in academics such as math, science, reading, etc. You don't pass or fail this test but it's very important that you do your best on it so they can determine what classes you'll take.

The questions on the test are all based on answers to previous questions and thankfully it's not timed so you can take your sweet time.

The College-Level Examination Program (CLEP)

The College-Level Examination Program gives you the opportunity to receive college credit for what you already know by earning qualifying scores on any of 33 examinations. Earn credit for knowledge you've acquired through independent study, on-the-job training, professional development, cultural pursuits, or internships.

Signing Up to Take a CLEP Test at Redwood Road-Taylorsville Campus

1. General Information about the CLEP is found in the [Information for Candidates](#) pamphlet and the [College Board CLEP Brochure](#). (Available at the Redwood Road-Taylorsville Campus Testing Center) We are located in the Construction Trades Building (on the South East Side of the Campus) enter on the East side of the building. We are in room 033 in the basement.
2. There are 33 CLEP examinations. Each CLEP test gives the tester six credit hours. **Salt Lake Community College accepts four of these tests:**
 - a. **College Composition** (which give the tester credit for [English 1010](#) and [three elective credits](#)).
 - b. **Natural Sciences** (which gives credit for three hours of [Physical Science](#) plus three credit hours of [Biological Science](#)).
 - c. **Humanities** (which gives credit for three hours of [Fine Arts](#) and three credit hours of [Humanities](#)).
 - d. **Social Science/History** (which gives credit for three hours of [HIST 1700](#) and three hours of [Social Science](#)).
3. The CLEP tests are taken on the computer. Each test is timed. The College Composition takes two hours; each of the other tests is allotted an hour and a half.
4. The cost to take the CLEP is paid with two different payments. \$25.00 is paid directly to Salt Lake Community College with cash or check; \$77.00 is paid directly to CLEP (as of July 1, 2010). The tester can either pay this payment by check made out to CLEP or enter their credit card information into the computer before beginning the test. CLEP will bill the tester directly and ask for a credit or debit card charge of \$77.00. Payments made by check will require a CLEP payment envelope enclosed with a copy of the printout of the student's attendance record in the mailing envelope.
5. There are 80 points possible for each of the CLEP tests. Salt Lake Community College requires a score of 50 to pass the test. The results will appear on their transcript as a PASS and will not affect their GPA. Students who have taken a class before and received a "C" or higher cannot take the CLEP. Testers who fail the CLEP have to wait six months before they can retake the test, no exceptions.
6. Results of each test (except College Composition) print out when the test is completed. The College Composition Test consists of 50 multiple choice questions and 2 written essays. The essays are scored every two weeks. All testers, taking CLEP tests for Salt Lake Community College, must fill out a form after completing the test. They fill this form out in the CLEP room where they will receive a copy of their results.
7. The official results of each CLEP test will be sent to both the tester and their school. The official results take anywhere

REANNEN BREWER ON CLEP EXAMINATION

- Have you ever been in a class where your like “I know this I don’t need this class”. We all have, this is what the CLEP exam is for. It is a test that you can take to test out of a class for credits. You earn credit for the stuff that you already know. CLEP stands for (College-Level-Examination-Program).
- There are 33 different tests that you can take, ranging from a number of different classes. But only 4 are accepted by SLCC they are College Composition, Natural Sciences, Humanities, and Social Science/History.
- Each test is about and hour and a half, there are 80 points possible for each test and you must get a 50. The exam costs 25.00 to SLCC and 77.00 is paid directly to CLEP. You can get up to 6 college credits for one test.
